## Regional Flavor Profiles

### Stagecoach, Atlas Peak

Singular fruit, dark color, big tannin and acid. Blackberry and currant flavors that linger. Strong tannic finish.

### Lower Boulder, Oakville (alluvial)

Rich, ripe fruit w/silky tannin. Smoky cherry and tobacco aromas. White chocolate. Cigar and coffee notes. Green olive, moderate acid.

### Dr. Crane, St. Helena (alluvial)

Chocolate, tar, licorice, with blueberry, cedar and coffee nuances. Heavy tannin, moderate acidity.

### Bella Vista, Diamond Mountain area

Mountain elevation: intense fruit and moderate tannin, slight herbal and mineral notes, licorice, cinnamon and cedar. Blackberry pie, strawberry, hay, white chocolate and Bing cherry.

### Meteor, Coombsville District

Blackberry, eucalyptus, plum and strawberry. Rich mouth feel. Dark color. Cedar, spice, cinnamon. Horehound candy. Heavy tannin.

### Spanos-Berberian (Pritchard Hill)

Opulent fruit. Velvety. Rich yet elegant. Intensity of color and flavor. Well-balanced.
